ADMONITION BY CONSENT

Dear Ms. Brandeis:

The Disciplinary Review Board reviewed the motion for discipline by consent (admonition) filed by the District IV Ethics Committee. After a review of the record, the Board determined to grant the motion and to issue a letter of admonition. Specifically, on September 20, 1999 you were declared ineligible to practice law for failure to pay the 1999 annual assessment to the New Jersey Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection. During the time of your ineligibility, you handled three cases in New Jersey and appeared in hearings on September 10, 1999 and May 17, 2000 in connection with these matters. Your conduct was unethical and in violation of RPC 5.5(a).

In imposing only an admonition, the Board considered that you were unable to pay immediately the annual assessment as a result of financial problems.


Your conduct adversely reflected not only upon you as an attorney, but also upon all members of the bar. Accordingly, the Board has directed the issuance of this admonition to you. R. 1:20-15(f)(4).
