The Disciplinary Review Board reviewed the motion for discipline by consent (reprimand or such lesser discipline as the Board may determine is warranted) filed by the Office of Attorney Ethics in the above matter, pursuant to R. 1:20-10. Following a review of the record, the Board determined to grant the motion. In the Board's view, a reprimand is the appropriate discipline for respondent's violation of RPC 5.5(a)(1) (practicing law while ineligible).

Specifically, on September 27, 2010, respondent was suspended from the practice of law for failure to pay the New Jersey Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection (CPF) annual assessment for 2010. Although respondent was aware of his suspension and concomitant ineligibility, he continued to practice law through January 30, 2012, after which he paid his past due assessments and was reinstated. In all, respondent represented clients in two matters.

I/M/O Ronald J. Brandmayr, Jr.

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Respondent cited his own poor financial condition as the reason why he had not paid the annual assessment when it was due, but conceded that, by continuing to practice law unabated during his period of ineligibility, he violated RPC 5.5(a)(1).

In mitigation, respondent has no prior final discipline since his 2002 admission to the bar. He also acknowledged his wrongdoing and conserved disciplinary resources by entering into the consent to discipline. Finally, he has paid the delinquent fees to the CPF.
