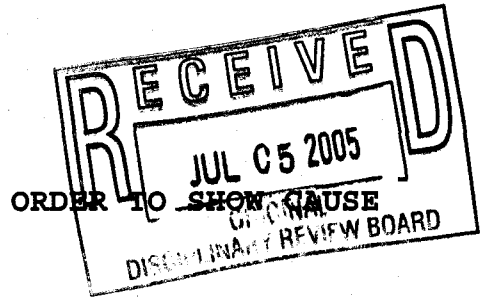

The Disciplinary Review Board having filed with the Court its decision in DRB 05-022, recommending that **VINCENT E. BEVACQUA** of **NEWARK**, who was admitted to the bar of this State in 1990, and who thereafter was suspended from the practice of law for a period of six months by Order of this Court filed May 20, 2004, effective June 15, 2004, and who remains suspended at this time, be disbarred, and good cause appearing;

It is ORDERED that **VINCENT E. BEVACQUA** show cause before this Court on Monday, September 12, 2005, at 2:00 p.m. in the Supreme Court courtroom, Hughes Justice Complex, Trenton, why he should not be disbarred or otherwise disciplined; and it is further

ORDERED that David E. Johnson, Jr., Esquire, or his designee, present this matter to the Court; and it is further


ORDERED that respondent shall file an original and eight copies of his brief with the Clerk of the Court, and serve two copies of the brief on the Office of Attorney Ethics, on or before August 3, 2005, and the Office of Attorney Ethics shall serve and file a responding brief, if any, on or before August 31, 2005; and it is further

ORDERED that the six-month suspension of respondent, entered by Order of this Court filed May 20, 2004, effective June 15, 2004, shall continue pending the further Order of the Court; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent shall continue to be restrained and enjoined from practicing law during the period of his suspension, and that he continue to comply with Rule 1:20-20 dealing with suspended attorneys.
