dissent from the majority and vote to respondent's disbarment. I do so not because of respondent's disciplinary record, but because already disciplined an attorney, who then fails to comply with an Order of the Court entered because of conduct previously determined to unethical, manifests a disdain for the disciplinary process and the responsibilities attendant to the privilege of permitted to practice the profession of the law. If the Board were to recommend disbarment, respondent would be compelled to appear before the Court to explain why he or she has not complied with the Court's Order requiring the filing of the R. 1:20-20 affidavit. I believe that this should occur.

By such a procedure, I believe that the public and respondent's clients would be protected from the consequences of respondent's suspension and all attorneys would quickly come to understand and appreciate the importance of compliance with the Court's Orders and the grave potential consequences of non-compliance.
