The Disciplinary Review Board having filed with the Court its decision in DRB 19-110, recommending that as a matter of reciprocal discipline pursuant to Rule 1:20-14(a)(4)(E), **Michael Peter Guido of Orlando, Florida**, who was admitted to the bar of this State in 1986, be disbarred based on discipline imposed in Florida for unethical conduct that in New Jersey constitutes violations of RPC 1.3(lack of diligence), RPC 8.4(b)(criminal act that reflects adversely on the lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness or fitness as a lawyer in other respects), RPC 8.4(c)(conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or misrepresentation) and the principles of In re Wilson, 81 NJ 451 (1979), and In re Hollendonner, 102 NJ 21 (1985)(knowing misappropriation of trust funds), and RPC 8.4(d)(conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice);

And **Michael Peter Guido** having failed to appear on the Order directing him to show cause why he should not be disbarred or otherwise disciplined;

And good cause appearing;

It is ORDERED that **Michael Peter Guido** be disbarred, effective immediately, and that his name be stricken from the roll of attorneys;

ORDERED that **Michael Peter Guido** be and hereby is permanently

restrained and enjoined from practicing law; and it is further


ORDERED that all funds, if any, currently existing or hereinafter deposited in any New Jersey financial institution maintained by **Michael Peter Guido** pursuant to Rule 1:21-6 be restrained from disbursement except on application to this Court, for good cause shown, and shall be transferred by the financial institution to the Clerk of the Superior Court, who is directed to deposit the funds in the Superior Court Trust Fund pending the further Order of this Court; and it is further

ORDERED that **Michael Peter Guido** comply with Rule 1:20-20 dealing with disbarred attorneys; and it is further

ORDERED that the entire record of this matter be made a permanent part of respondent's file as an attorney at law of this State; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent reimburse the Disciplinary Oversight Committee for appropriate administrative costs and actual expenses incurred in the prosecution of this matter, as provided in Rule 1:20-17.
