The Disciplinary Review Board having filed with the Court its decision in DRB 21-263, concluding that as a matter of final discipline pursuant to Rule 1:20-13(c)(2), Martin E. Kofman of Brooklyn, New York, who was admitted to the bar of this State in 1986, and who has been temporarily suspended from the practice of law since November 19, 2021, pursuant to Rule 1:20-13 (b) (1), should be suspended from practice for a period of two years, based on respondent's conviction following a plea of guilty in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York to one count of conspiracy to make false statements to lenders in violation of 18 U.S.C. §371, conduct in violation of RPC 8.4(b) (committing a criminal act that reflects adversely on a lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness, or fitness as a lawyer in other respects) and RPC 8.4 (c) (engaging in conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation);

And the Disciplinary Review Board further having determined that respondent's suspension from practice should be retroactive to the date of respondent's temporary suspension from practice;

And good cause appearing;

It is ORDERED that **Martin E. Kofman** is suspended from the practice of law for a period of two years and until the further Order of the Court, effective November 19, 2021; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent continue to comply with Rule 1:20-20 dealing with suspended attorneys; and it is further

ORDERED that the entire record of this matter be made a permanent part of respondent's file as an attorney at law of this State; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent reimburse the Disciplinary Oversight

Committee for appropriate administrative costs and actual expenses incurred in
the prosecution of this matter, as provided in Rule 1:20-17.
