O R D E R

The Disciplinary Review Board having filed with the Court its decision in DRB 25-246, recommending as a matter of final discipline pursuant to Rule 1:20-13(c)(2) that **Marc William Nuzzo of Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania**, who was admitted to the bar of this State in 2002 and changed his status to retired on March 10, 2010, should be suspended from the practice of law for three months following respondent's convictions in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Court of Common Pleas of McKean County, for first-degree misdemeanor involuntary manslaughter, in violation of 18 Pa. C.S. § 2504(a), three counts of third-degree felony aggravated assault by vehicle, in violation of 75 Pa. C.S. § 3732.1(a), six counts of second-degree misdemeanor recklessly endangering another person, in violation of 18 Pa. C.S. § 2705(a), and numerous summary offenses, and for violating RPC 8.4(b) (committing a criminal act that reflects adversely on the lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness, or

fitness as a lawyer); and

The Disciplinary Review Board having further recommended that respondent's three-month suspension should be deferred until such time as respondent seeks to resume the practice of law; and

The Court having determined that a deferred suspension is appropriate because respondent was in retired status at the time of the misconduct, remains in retired status, and has never practiced law in New Jersey;

And good cause appearing;

It is ORDERED that **Marc William Nuzzo** is suspended from the practice of law for three months, and the suspension is deferred until such time as respondent seeks to resume the practice of law in New Jersey; and it is further

ORDERED that if respondent determines to resume the practice of law, respondent shall immediately inform the Clerk of the Supreme Court and the Director of the Office of Attorney Ethics; and it is further

ORDERED that on the commencement of the deferred suspension, respondent shall comply with Rule 1:20-20 dealing with suspended attorneys; and it is further

ORDERED that pursuant to Rule 1:20-20(c), respondent's failure to comply with the Affidavit of Compliance requirement of Rule 1:20-20(b)(15)

may (1) preclude the Disciplinary Review Board from considering respondent's petition for reinstatement for a period of up to six months from the date respondent files proof of compliance; (2) be found to constitute a violation of RPC 8.1(b) and RPC 8.4(d); and (3) provide a basis for an action for contempt pursuant to Rule 1:10-2; and it is further

ORDERED that the entire record of this matter be made a permanent part of respondent's file as an attorney at law of this State; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent reimburse the Disciplinary Oversight Committee for appropriate administrative costs and actual expenses incurred in the prosecution of this matter, as provided in Rule 1:20-17.
